		At Glengort South, Limerick, the forest gates are locked in order to control trespass. This property has recently been purchased by SWFS but no efforts have been made to invite public access. At Cummeenavrick, Co Kerry, public access is discouraged, following a spate of recent vandalism and theft. The problems caused by illegal use of the forest, including dumping rubbish and theft cause real difficulties. However, those people who are simply seeking recreational access may be denied access to the forest.					
		Close-out evidence:					
		SWFS intend to discuss the general solutions to this problem at a future meeting of managers. Consideration will be given to the inclusion of welcoming words on forest signs and the provision of stiles to allow pedestrian access while preventing or deterring vehicula access and dumping. Progress will be checked at next surveillance.
